Margret Romanowa is 68 years old. She has 3 grownup children and 3 grandchildren. Her youngest daughter, Kathrin, is 42 years old and a lesbian. The relationship between Mrs. Romanowa and Katrin is nice and Mrs. Romanowa supports Katrin in growing up the children as good as she can. She says that some homosexuals are presenting themselves exaggeratedly, but the natural being is
